The Women's League of Rutgers University (WLRU), founded in 1932, raises funds to support scholarships for Rutgers-New Brunswick undergraduate students. WLRU also provides educational and social opportunities for its members.

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, MUFFIN LORD

Dear WLRU Members & Friends, What a year we had!

Our official partnership with the Rutgers Alumni Association continues to be beneficial. The RAA publishes a web-based newsletter every month and includes a post from the WLRU. The result has been a number of new members and a variety of connections.

The WLRU Endowed Community Service Scholarship, established in 1983, recognizes undergraduates who achieve academic excellence, have financial need, and demonstrate significant public service involvement and commitment. In its first year, WLRU presented awards of \$100 each to three students. Last year, because of so many generous donations, we were able to make awards of \$1400 to ten undergraduates, whom we honored at our annual Scholarship reception.

Our fall programs and events included a Welcome Gathering; our Garage Sale, which raised over \$5000 for our scholarships; a visit to the Zimmerli Art Museum for "Smoke and Mirrors," an exhibit featuring artists with disabilities; and finally our Holiday Luncheon, with Shawna Hudson, RC 1992, and Senior Associate Dean for Population Health Research at RWJMS and Vice Chancellor for Dissemination and Implementation Science at Rutgers Health as our speaker.

In the spring we enjoyed a conversation on Zoom with past Scholarship recipients; we visited the Zimmerli Art Museum again, this time for "Indigenous Identities: Here, Now, & Always;" we visited

Elijah's Promise Culinary School for brunch and a cooking class; we had a table at Highland Park Street Fair; and finally our End-of -the Year Luncheon which included a presentation by Laura Lawson, Dean of SEBS.

We look forward to our 93rd year with a full calendar of events! Here's a teaser: the speaker for the End of the Year Luncheon will be Ellen Mappen, telling us about her progress writing a history of the WLRU.

We hope you will support the WLRU through membership, attendance at our programs, and donations - and we also hope you will tell your friends and colleagues about all that we offer.
